IX. Superintendent's Report – Dr. Paul Gausman

Dr. Gausman stated:

- The October 8, 2012 School Board meeting falls on the same evening as the Chamber of Commerce annual dinner. He asked Board members if they wished to move that meeting so they can attend the dinner. The Board agreed to move the meeting.
- He will include in his next *Informational Update*, the data the Board requested at the July 16, 2012 School Board meeting related to the Human Resources Strategic Plan Update.
- The District has received their AYP (Adequate Yearly Progress) report and he was pleased to announce that for the first time in 6 years, the District has been removed from DINA status and has now been placed on Delay status. This was achieved by meeting AYP with every subgroup in two grade spans for the assessments in math or reading.
- There were 21 subgroups that met AYP this year, as compared to 11 subgroups last year.
- Bryant, Emerson, Hunt, Irving, and Longfellow Elementary Schools were moved to Delay status in math. Whittier Elementary School was removed from Delay status in math. Unity Elementary School was removed from Watch status. North High School was moved to Delay status in both reading and math. East High School was moved to Delay status in reading.
- He invited Board members to attend the all staff convocation on Wednesday, August 15, at 8:00 a.m. at the Long Lines Rec Center.

X. Discussion / Information

A. K-12 Guidance and Counseling Program Review and Redesign

Marilyn Charging provided an overview of the work done to redesign and implement the K-12 guidance and counseling program:

- The program was reorganized to reflect the changes within the parameters of the At-Risk Allowable Growth Grant.
- Graduation coaches have been designated at each high school and middle school, as well as two of our elementary buildings.
- There are currently 27 counselors who will provide counseling services in the areas of: counseling curriculum, individual planning, system support, and responsive services.
- The counselor to student ratio is:
 - Elementary School 1 to 1,070
 - o Middle School 1 to 328
 - o High School 1 to 342

Jean Peters introduced Kim Burrack, District Preschool Administrator, who shared a brief overview and data related to the preschool transition program which focuses on helping preschool students transition into transitional kindergarten or kindergarten.
