I. Call to Order / Pledge of Allegiance

President Krysl called the regular meeting to order at 6:06 p.m.

II. Roll Call of Members

III. Approval of Agenda

Director Williams moved and Director Warnstadt seconded the motion to approve the agenda. The motion carried 7 to 0.

IV. Good News Report(s) – Liberty Elementary School

Stacie Henderson (Principal), Cindy Roberts (Math Coach), Jason De La Rosa (5th grade teacher), and Holly Corcoran (4th grade teacher) shared information about the opportunities for student learning outside of the classroom.

- Currently offer Basketball, Volleyball, and Math Club, and have begun discussing the possibility of adding a Soccer league.
- Research connects student achievement with extracurricular activities; better grades, increased test scores, increased attendance, etc.
- Programs made possible by donation of time from teachers, staff, parents, Mercy Medical Center grant, partnership with Sunnybrook Community Church, and the Sioux City Schools Foundation.
- Students; Estevan Quintana, Kamari Jones, Mercedes Cisneros, Astud Luna, Citlally Lara, and Jyshelle Jackson shared what they enjoyed most about the after school programs.

XI. Superintendent's Report – Dr. Paul Gausman

Dr. Gausman:

- He thanked those who helped with the District's first ever "Remembering Our Fallen" assembly. The exhibit is a 40' portable wall featuring those who have died in service to our Country from our region since the war on terror began September 11, 2001. The display will be featured in each of our three high schools for one week beginning this week at East High School. He shared the following highlights from the assembly:
 - o Flag folding ceremony where the audience learned about each fold of the flag.
 - o Guest speaker who spoke on behalf of the David Lee Rice family. David was a 2001 graduate of East High School who gave his life to service to his Country.
 - o Chris McGowan, President of Siouxland Chamber of Commerce and veteran of the Air National Guard, also spoke to the audience.
 - o Staff Sergeant Jeff Soukup, East High School Band Director, played "Taps" at the close of the ceremony.
 - o He praised the combined choir from all three high schools.
- He asked Board members for their legislative suggestions for the District to write position statements or white papers for this year's Chamber's annual trip to D.C. in April. He made the following suggestions; Career Academies, Impact on Sequestration, and E-Rate Program. Concepts are due by mid-February.
- He recognized student teachers in attendance.

XII. Discussion / Information

A. School Calendar

Jill Knuth, Director of Human Resources, presented the final version of the 2013-14 school calendar, and recommendations for the 2014-15 and 2015-16 school calendars, highlighting the following:

- She made no recommendations to the 2013-14 and 2014-15 school calendars since they were presented to the Board last year.
- She took the calendars to a number of committees for feedback.
- Each calendar represents 180 student days and 193 teacher contract days.
- The administration recommends that the Board approve the District's school calendar for the 2013-14 school year, and acknowledge the calendars for 2014-15 and 2015-16 school years.

B. FY14 Budget Revenue Projections and Assumptions

Gordon Winterlin, Director of Finance, presented revenue projections and various assumptions for the FY14 budget featuring the following:

- Allowable Growth is unknown at this time.
- Status of Federal Grants is unknown at this time.
- 0% Allowable Growth, 2% Allowable Growth, and 4% Allowable Growth revenue projections were presented.
 - o 0% Allowable Growth model showed a 1.07% increase in revenue.
 - o 2% Allowable Growth model showed a 2.62% increase in revenue.
 - o 4% Allowable Growth model showed a 4.17% increase in revenue.
- Property taxes are unknown at this time, but if the current rate is maintained, there will be a \$1.1 million dollar increase in property taxes.

The District standardized its computer platform on Windows 7 and Office 2010 through the spring and summer of 2011. In order to upgrade computers the district was faced with the prospect of upgrading its enterprise through a standard software purchase that would have cost over \$550,000. Rather than commit that level of resourcing at one time, the board approved software licensing in February 2011 through Microsoft's Enrollment for Education Solution (EES). This licensing strategy allows the district to pay a reduced rate only per full time user dramatically reducing costs to \$78,296.39 per year. This cost is fixed for at least the first three years. The district would have to run the same operating system for more than seven years to break even compared to the old model. The longest the district has ever run the same operating system package before is six years.

Because this is approved software for the Microsoft Settlement the district will be able to charge this cost to the settlement through at least FY15 and likely further fiscal years.

Policy Title: Workplace Bullying

Code Number: 403.5

The purpose of this policy is to promote a healthy, positive workplace climate so that every individual is able to contribute fully to our educational community. Every person has the right to dignity at work. The rights and responsibilities described in this policy apply to all employees, parents, and all who utilize or visit District facilities.

Bullying is defined as conduct that a reasonable person would find hostile, intimidating, offensive, humiliating or an abuse of authority. It may be verbal, nonverbal, public or private. It is typically behavior repeated across multiple incidents; a single incident is rarely usually not a violation, unless it is a serious incident. It may originate from any employee or from any individual to another. It is also bullying to continue policy-violating conduct when the targeted individual requests that it cease.

Illustrative examples of bullying include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Provocative or dehumanizing name calling
- 2. Belittling the person
- 3. Exclusion from requisite training
- 4. Physical isolation
- 5. Rumors (or failing to stop them) & and gossip about a person or school's reputation where rumors or gossip contain information which is libelous, defamatory, obscene, or maliciously false or contain statements which are meant to harm a person's reputation or that contribute to a hostile work environment on the basis of age, race, sex, religion, disability, or any other status protected by law
- 6. Discounting or humiliating people at meetings
- 7. Deliberate exclusion from job-critical decision-making opportunities
- 8. Preventing the person from self-expression, being yelled at, being threatened, the prohibition of speaking to others
- 9. Intentional deception about the true purpose of an investigatory or disciplinary meeting
- 10. Preventing an employee from meeting students' academic potential

11. Moving or hiding items required for productive work

For an individual to allege a policy violation, to call it bullying according to this policy's standard, the targeted individual must be able to demonstrate that due to the alleged bullying activity that he/she has experienced negative consequences which are affecting their ability to perform his/her job. It is the intent of this policy that such issues are identified early by the targeted individual, a co-worker or colleague, and the issue is resolved at the earliest possible stage.

This policy supplements but does not replace the District's Discrimination and Harassment Policy (Board Policy 504.4).

Bullying must not be confused with the non-abusive exercise of management rights to assign tasks, coach, and reprimand or take disciplinary actions against employees. Any administrator, supervisor or individual in a position of leadership to whom a complaint is reported (verbally or in writing) must take appropriate action according to internal procedures. Failure to comply may result in disciplinary action.

Freedom from retaliation is protected under this policy. Retaliation is a separate offense from the original claim of bullying. Protected individuals include complainants, or any one who testifies, assists, or participates in any manner in an investigation or proceeding, internal or external, pertaining to the allegation of bullying.

Misuse of the policy is a violation of the policy itself.

In the spring of 2010 the District conducted its first ever Request for Proposal process to implement purchase agreements similar to those previously done with computers for network equipment (switches) and wireless equipment (access points, controllers, etc.). These bid agreements sought to standardize purchases of equipment through a single vendor for a predefined period of time with approximate, but not contractually obligated, quantities. Additionally, the agreements satisfy E-Rate requirements that the District must bid equipment that is submitted through the E-Rate process. Vendors understand as part of the agreement process that any E-Rate equipment purchases are completely dependent on the District being awarded E-Rate funding. Currently the network equipment agreement has expired and the wireless equipment agreement will expire shortly.

In order to satisfy E-Rate requirements and reestablish district purchase agreements the District conducted a new RFP process over the month of January 2013. Three separate RFPs were sent out to cover network equipment, wireless equipment, and for the first time network wiring. Several weighted criteria are used to determine the winner in each area (see attached slides for details).

The network equipment E-Rate bid covers NHS, WHS, and EMS. The E-Rate wireless and wiring bid covers 11 buildings three of which are 90 percent (Irving, Liberty, and Unity) and the rest are 80 percent (meaning E-rate will pay 90 or 80 percent of total costs). It is likely that 90 percent buildings will be funded, while 80 percent buildings are far less certain. The district has received 80 percent building funds once in the last 10 years. Total costs of all E-Rate applications is \$487,000. If funded, E-Rate would pay \$379,000 and the district would be responsible for \$108,000. The district amount is built into the technology PPEL allocation.

In addition to E-Rate, the purchase agreements will cover new construction, budgeted refresh, and other replacement over the next three years.

Studies show consistency of staff in a building is a predictor of student achievement. Increasing awareness of safe working practices will drive behavior in a positive way to impact not only worker's compensation claims but also attendance and subsequently student achievement.

Recommendation:

That the Board of Directors reviews the impact of the programs and approves the recommendations as presented.
